About the Program

The Oral Health Education Program at the Windsor Family Health Team is available **free** of cost to **enrolled** patients/clients **of all ages, WITHOUT private dental insurance**. The Oral Health Education Program is **also available to clients with referring PCP's** of the Team Care Centre. Ask your provider about the program or give us a call for more information.

Our program will give patients the maximum benefits through education in the following modules:

- Brushing & Flossing
- Dry Mouth Management
- Periodontal (Gum) Disease
- Caries and Decay Process Info.
- Smoking/Vaping Info.
- Prenatal and Infant Oral Health
- Youth and Adolescent Oral Health
- Oral Cancer



Patients will receive an **oral cancer screening, a visual assessment of teeth and gums, and a cavity risk check.**

Preventative treatments are available on an as needed basis, this includes:

Fluoride Varnish Applications:

Aid in the prevention of caries and treatment of hypersensitive teeth.

Silver Diamine Fluoride Application:

Can arrest the progression of an already formed cavity in primary or permanent teeth.
Can also help decrease dental sensitivity.

The Oral Health Education program is an **education-based** program that **does not** provide traditional dental services including teeth cleanings, teeth whitening, fillings, etc.

Provisions are also provided free of cost to patients. This include's but is not limited to: toothbrush, toothpaste, floss, rubber tip stimulator, saliva substitute product samples, mouthwash, tongue cleaner, denture brush, etc.
